A brief Board Room dedication ceremony on October 16, 2009 was attended by members of NYCC’s Board of Trustees and by Mrs. Marjorie Carnival, wife of the late Richard E. Carnival, DC, Trustee Emeritus and long time friend of NYCC who passed away in July of 2009 at the age of 80.

NYCC’s Board Room will henceforth be known as the Richard E. Carnival Board Room, and a plaque bearing the following inscription has been mounted on the Board Room wall: “Richard E. Carnival, DC. In recognition of his outstanding commitment to the College through devoted service to the Board of Trustees and a lifetime of invaluable contributions to the chiropractic profession. His wisdom and leadership were an inspiration to all who served with him.” A replica of the plaque was presented to Mrs. Carnival.

Dr. Carnival’s many accomplishments and professional affiliations include service as the first president of the New York State Chiropractic Association, member and chair of the New York State Board for Chiropractic, president of the American College of Chiropractors, and at-large member of the Board of Directors of the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners from 1982 to 1994. He was elected to the NYCC Board of Trustees on two separate occasions, serving with distinction from 1974 to 1984 and again from 1990 through 2002, holding the position of board chair from 1998 to 2001. Dr. Carnival was an early advocate for the development of the acupuncture and Oriental medicine master’s degree program at the college.

Lester Levine, DC, (NYCC '60) (Then Columbia Institute of Chiropractic)

Lester Levine, DC, joined New York Chiropractic College's President's Council in 2003 after talking with Eric Kaplan, DC, and NYCC President Dr. Frank Nicchi. Dr. Levine realized that it is important to give back to the educational institution that has given him the tools to help sick and suffering humanity, and at the same time earn an outstanding living for his family. Levine first became acquainted with NYCC in 1970, then Columbia Institute of Chiropractic (CIC) on 71st and Broadway in Manhattan. His personal chiropractor, Reggie Gold, DC, in Spring Valley, New York, recommended the school. He enrolled and commuted with Dr. Gold's wife Irene, who was also attending.

Prior to chiropractic college, he graduated from Long Island University with a Bachelor of Science degree. He graduated with honors from CIC in 1974. Since then he has become certified in acupuncture and meridian therapy. He is also a certified addictionologist and is a member of the American Chiropractic Association and the Florida Chiropractic Association.

Levine states that he owes a great deal to his parents who instilled a strong "blue

collar" work ethic. Failure was never an option. He believes in accommodating his patients, treating them the way he wanted his family treated, which has served him well. He credits those people in his life who have given him good counsel. One, Dr. Kaplan, warned that "pigs get fat and hogs get slaughtered." Friend Jay Seltzer, DC, encouraged Levine to never stop learning. Levine sees a bright future for chiropractic though it faces challenges that await all the healing arts. He views

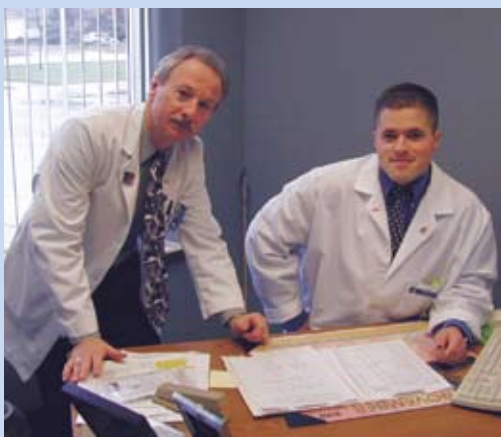
NYCC as an academic leader that provides students with the educational tools necessary to succeed, especially under direction of Dr. Nicchi.

Central Florida was Levine's choice to practice for 35 years. An injury forced him to sell his practice last year. After sitting home for six months being bored, he decided to form a small consulting group to help chiropractors, mainly with their decompression department.

Levine and his wife of 40 years, Gloria, enjoy traveling worldwide, and visiting their three children, Lauren and her husband Craig, Darcie and Joshua. They get great pleasure from their two grandchildren, Zoe (8) and Sam (4). As empty nesters, they enjoy going out to dinner, movies and watching Florida State University athletic events.

Levine acknowledges that administering chiropractic treatment can be physically demanding and encourages his colleagues to take precautions. He closes with the following sage advice: "Never be afraid of greatness, don't dwell on negativity, stay focused, have definitive goals, and get a mentor," he said. "You cannot soar with eagles when you play with turkeys."

In Memoriam

NYCC Mourns Passing of its Nutrition Program Founder

NYCC mourns the loss of Shari Lieberman, PhD, CDN, and Founding Dean of its School of Applied Clinical Nutrition. On July 20, 2009, Dr. Lieberman succumbed to metastatic breast cancer, at the age of 51.

A pre-eminent authority on nutrition, Lieberman held an MS in Nutrition, Food Science and Dietetics from New York University and a PhD in Clinical Nutrition and Exercise Physiology from the Union Institute, Cincinnati, OH. She founded not one, but two fully accredited masters programs in Clinical Nutrition - one at the University of Brockport and the other at NYCC in 2006.

of the Year Award. Lieberman had been in private practice as a clinical nutritionist for more than 20 years.

As an industry consultant, peer reviewer for scientific publications and a published scientific researcher, Dr. Lieberman authored successful books that included The Real Vitamin and Mineral Book, User's Guide To Brain-Boosting Supplements, Dare To Lose: 4 Simple Steps to a Better Body, and All About Vitamin C. She was a frequent guest on television and radio and her name appeared in magazines as the authority on nutrition.

Shari shared her extensive knowledge with NYCC in many ways. As keynote speaker for the Women's Health Symposium for several years she shared her expertise with the NYCC community and the community at large about such topics as food's affect on state of mind, and how to feel great, look great and lose weight. A tremendous asset to the College, Dr. Shari Lieberman will be missed.

A memorial award will be established in Dr. Shari Lieberman's name to recognize outstanding performance by students in the NYCC School of Applied Clinical Nutrition.

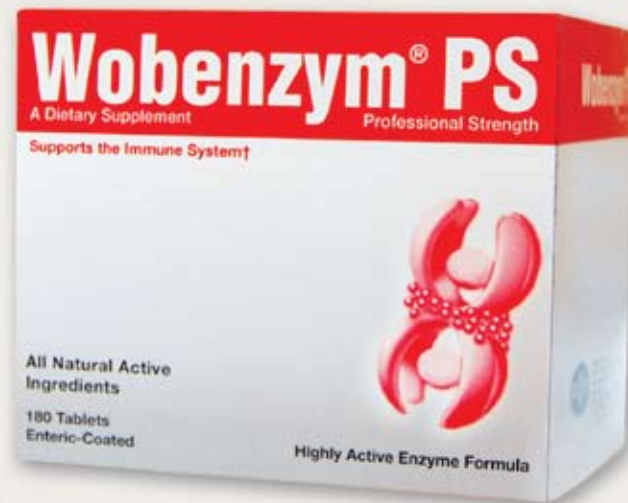

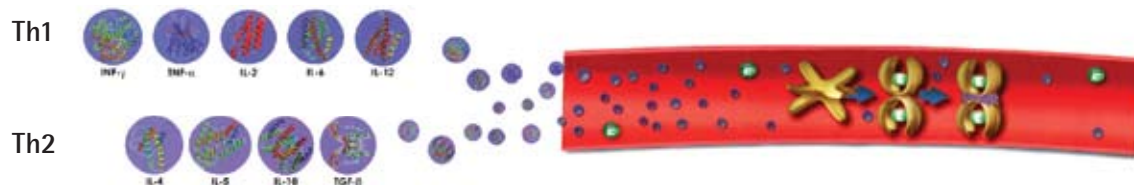

NYCC “Going Online” with Master’s in Applied Clinical Nutrition

New York Chiropractic College received approval from the New York State Education Department to deliver its Master of Science in Applied Clinical Nutrition (MSACN) program completely online. The College plans to convert the nutrition curriculum to an online, distance-learning, Web-based format via Desire2Learn (D2L) software by September 2010.

NYCC’s MSACN program is uniquely structured to provide a comprehensive professional education that will prepare graduates for employment in a variety of settings including private practice, integrative practice with other professionals, research, and industry consulting.

NYCC Executive Vice President of Academic Affairs Michael Mestan, DC, describes the new online initiative as “a successful team effort that significantly enhances practitioners’ skills and benefits patients.”

Designed for practicing chiropractors, current chiropractic students and all other qualified healthcare professionals (i.e., nurses, medical physicians, dentists, etc.), matriculants can complete this master’s level program entirely online in the comfort of their homes.

The online program, emphasizing an integrative and natural healthcare approach, distinguishes itself through an outstanding faculty, innovative and diverse curricula, and an emphasis on the applied use of clinical nutrition in wellness and disease prevention and management. This sort of advanced training enables practitioners to expand



existing practices, offer more comprehensive treatment, and augment their professional success through interventions that incorporate diet, exercise, nutritional supplementation, and lifestyle modifications.

“We’re looking to teach healthcare practitioners who want to enhance their credentials and expand their practices by incorporating nutrition to address a myriad of health conditions,” explained Anna Kelles, PhD, director of the School of Applied Clinical Nutrition at NYCC, noting that nutrition is a fundamental

building block in the success of all healthcare treatments.

The flexibility of online learning will engage practitioners who cannot attend a traditional, on-site learning environment. With an online delivery system, the program will be available nationally, increasing the availability of this important information to a much wider audience. The increased number and location of highly trained healthcare providers with a clinical nutrition background will allow more patients to explore preventative care with their providers.



The Program's Goals and Attributes

Graduates will be able to design intervention programs that incorporate diet, exercise, and such nutritional supplementation recommendations as vitamins, minerals, botanicals, essential fatty acids, and amino acids - all targeted toward specific disease and wellness outcomes.

NYCC has made appropriate changes to the MSACN curriculum's design and assessment, support services, edu-

cational resources, faculty, training and the academic program review process to prepare for it to go online. The MSACN program will remain 36 credits (540 hours) offered across 6 trimesters. Courses will consist of 15-week online, interactive, courses delivered through the D2L learning management system. Instructional methods include readings from required textbooks, annotated or voice-over PowerPoint presentations, videocasts, asynchronous and synchronous discussion groups, virtual office hours, document sharing, e-mail interactions, and blogs. Student progress may be evaluated through research papers, graded homework, and electronic quizzes/tests. Even students' class participation may be assessed through their interactions in synchronous and asynchronous discussion groups, group blogs and document sharing, videocasts of group presentations, and annotated or voiced-over Power Point student presentations.

Special Assets

Dr. Mestan credits the online program's successful development to NYCC's hardworking people, a thorough strategic planning process, the College's technological infrastructure, and to a robust Internet bandwidth that enables ample data flow to and from the servers. "We purchased all the things we are going to need," he said. "And we are tweaking things constantly."

Emphasis on NYCC's Signature Excellence

"The institution did not undertake

the new online initiative lightly," Mestan remarked. "We wanted the program to exhibit the highest possible quality." The added convenience of taking coursework online will, in no way, reflect diminution in either quality or rigor. There are still deadlines and students may expect to emerge from their educational experience with both a valuable academic credential and a thorough understanding of the material.

Enrollment, Economies of Scale, and Ensuring Quality

It is anticipated that the number of enrollees will not significantly depart from numbers currently taking classes in the traditional classroom setting. As shown by colleges such as the University of Phoenix (with its 500,000 students) there is virtually no limit to the number of students who may take coursework online. Mestan points out, however, that NYCC will support highly qualified faculty members to teach and will maintain optimal student-faculty ratios.

"At the end of the day, a person who earns a degree from NYCC, regardless of whether earned in a brick-and-mortar classroom or online, will have had the same high-quality education and, undoubtedly, a heightened appreciation for who and what NYCC is," said Mestan.

“Bringing It Home” NYCC’s Online Journey



Tracing NYCC’s Journey to “Online Delivery”

In January 2009, NYCC Executive Vice President of Academic Affairs, Michael Mestan, DC, appointed a task force to review online delivery systems that would be a good fit for providing coursework to NYCC students on the Internet. Margaret Finn, DC (NYCC ’92), associate professor at NYCC, who had earned a Master of Arts in Teaching Using Internet Technologies degree from Marlboro College in Vermont, chaired the task force. While she had participated in many college committees, as she puts it, “this was the one that I feared the most and it turned out to be one of the easiest!”

The group recommended the Desire2Learn (D2L) online delivery system to the administration. The recently launched D2L program provides students with flexible access to class materials whenever, and from wherever, they choose. Rather than foreign, there remains the traditional “feel” of attending class and receiving instruction, but with greatly enhanced capabilities, ease of use, and flexibility in where and when you “attend class.” According to Faculty Development Director Kristina Petrocco-Napuli, DC, MS, and Instructional Technologist Liz Larzelere, MS, the learning management system “is like a ‘virtual building.’”

The D2L online format enables easy access to course content and encourages communication between instructors and students through messaging, e-mail, discussion boards, chat capabilities, online testing, and even a “drop-box” that acknowledges the deposit of assignments electronically with a receipt.

NYCC Strategic Initiative

NYCC is committed to provide, at least some of its master’s degree programs, online, according to Mestan. He knew the technology behind distance learning had come a long way since the time when students would tune to a certain television channel in large cities for class, or get videotapes mailed to their home. The D2L online format enables easy access to course content and encourages communication between instructors and students through messaging, e-mail, discussion boards, chat capabilities, online testing, and even a “drop-box” that acknowledges the deposit of assignments electronically with a receipt. Students simply “log on” and “log in”! The course is 100 percent online – everything needed is right at one’s fingertips. Have a question? Just e-mail your instructor or post it on a discussion board.

Students aren’t the only winners with D2L’s entry. Staff members will soon be able to take mini courses that make them more effective at their jobs. The faculty have already completed initial training, while the nutrition faculty have advanced further.

Faculty members can assume the role of student so as to better determine what to incorporate into quality coursework.

Some DC Coursework Online

Currently, NYCC has several online classes in the chiropractic program that enhance the College’s ‘Hub-and-Spoke’ model of education. Students serving out their internships off campus take chiropractic classes online as they administer healthcare treatment in the clinics. Karen Bobak, DC, Dean of Chiropractic for NYCC, said NYCC’s Doctor of Chiropractic program provides both elective and core classes online. With the new D2L system, the distance learning effort is just that much better. “This is absolutely tremendous,” Bobak said. “D2L is such a complete package and offers the students a rich educational experience.”

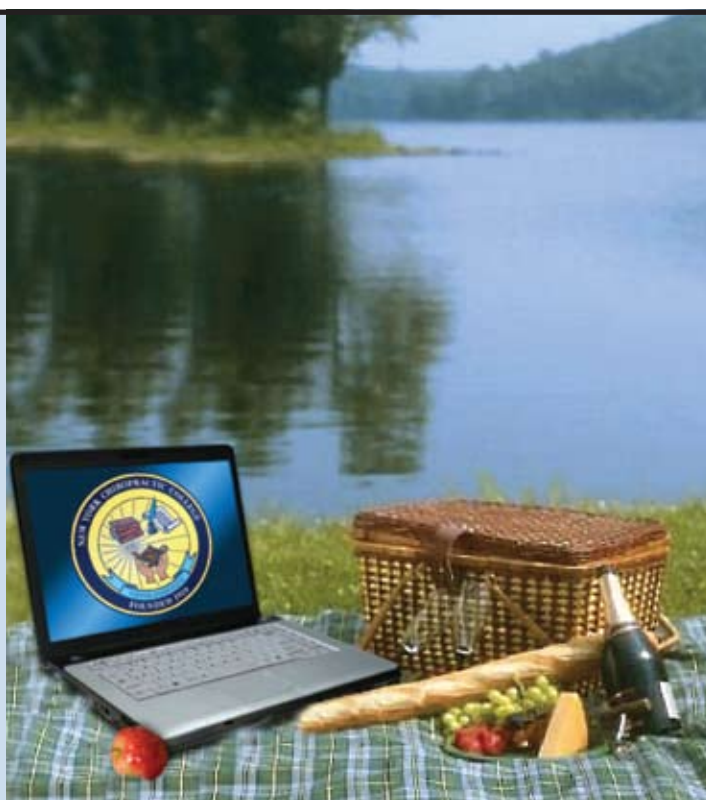
“While chiropractic is not a profession that can be completely delivered online due to the ‘hands on’ nature of the treatment, the opportunity to learn online offers tremendous value,” Bobak said.

Advances in technology have increased the ease of accessing course material for distance students and also traditional students opting to take a single course online. Online delivery is becoming increasingly common, and at top tier schools. Yale University offers introductory level courses online, as well as classes for its medical school

students. While distance education seems to be the new buzz word, its history may be traced to 19th-century correspondence courses.

Integrating Technology and Tradition

Online format offers flexibility. Readings and assignments are completed prior to the next session or by published due dates. Flexibility resides in course

schedules as well.

Online Only Colleges and Universities

DeVry University, Kaplan University, University of Phoenix, Walden University - what do all of these schools have in common? Every degree earned from one of these institutions is done exclusively online.

No classes are attended, learning is

done on one's own time, and at the end of the experience the participant has earned a degree. A number of universities and colleges offer strictly online classes where students need never meet in a designated location or with an instructor; lessons are learned and assignments turned in through an established Internet site. There has been recent growth in the number of students opting for this type of education. So what's all the excitement about?

The Online Appeal

Taking classes online is a more flexible method for students to earn a degree than traditional means. Lessons may be learned at the student's own pace, with deadlines of course. Mid-term and final examinations are taken directly on the course site. There need be no meeting scheduled for testing. NYCC has adopted the Desire2Learn online learning system. Testing may be proctored or not, closed or open book, at the instructor's discretion.

Students are able to manage their assignments on their time and from any computer with Internet access. This makes the courses quite convenient, unlike traditional classes with set meeting times. Advantages that attend controlling one's schedule benefit those who

hold full- or part-time jobs. Additionally, students who are juggling the demands of a family with the rigors of academia may find the online format to their liking. Literally, coursework may be completed at home in pajamas!

Instructors also warm up to this type of teaching. Lectures are posted on the server – eliminating time spent re-lecturing to students who missed class, or who come looking for handouts. The D2L program allows for weekly quizzes of up to 100 previously created questions. The software can also score the work of the students: no red pen needed.

Online Learning: Tracing its History

Distance learning has been a popular method for obtaining degrees since the late eighteen hundreds. Correspondence classes were developed to accommodate the highly dispersed American population as students hundreds of miles from one another took the same classes and received the same degree.

Through the mid-1990s, correspondence classes began to shift to other forms of distance learning provided by television and radio. Students could tune in to a local radio or television station at set times for their lessons. More recently, with the advent of the computer and Internet, additional avenues for distance

learning have blossomed.

Online Degree Programs on the Rise

The Sloan Consortium, a group involved in integrating online degree programs into mainstream education, reports that as of the fall semester 2009, 4.6 million students were enrolled in at least one online class and that online education experienced a 300 percent increase between 2002 and 2007 for strictly online programs. There was a 17 percent increase in online enrollment this year; while 2008 saw a 12 percent increase. Compare that with the 1.2 percent increase annually for traditional universities and colleges.

Students choosing to attend a traditional institution of higher learning typically had two options: live on campus or commute from home. Since not all students live within commuting distance of their preferred college, and since not every student is able to pack up and leave his or her family or job, online education clearly offers alternatives - no visits, no campus tours, just click and go. NYCC is excited about its new online initiatives to those who want to experience what the best natural healthcare college has to offer - without moving half way across the country to do so.

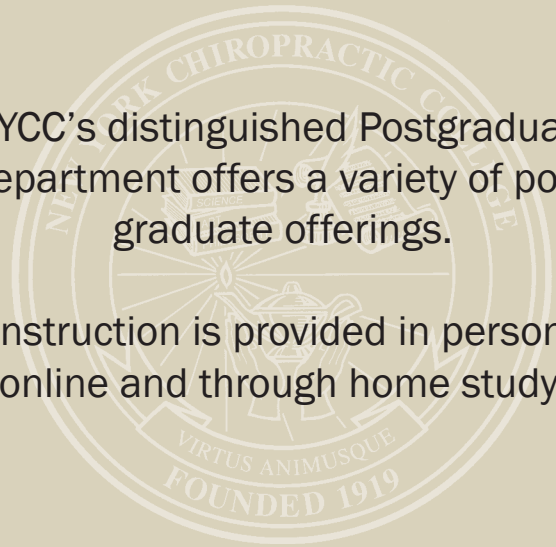

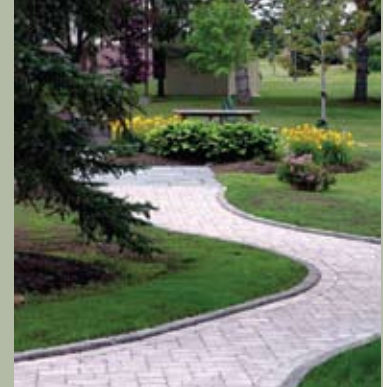

Student Spotlight

An “Online Student’s” Spotlight

Mathew E. DiMond, 8th Trimester Doctor of Chiropractic Student

With the advent of online classes at NYCC, Transitions magazine decided to cover a current chiropractic student, and his personal experiences with online course work.

This issue of *Transitions* features New York Chiropractic College’s exciting new online initiatives. Accordingly, we offer a “Student Spotlight” this time around – profiling Mathew DiMond who has extensive, first-hand, online learning experience. A self-described “Navy brat” whose father’s career as a Navy shipyards engineer moved the family up and down the East Coast for most of his youth, Mathew settled in western Pennsylvania and attended college at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP), where he obtained a Bachelor of Science in Natural Sciences and Mathematics Pre-med and a Bachelor of Arts in Psychological Sciences.

DiMond, in his eighth trimester at NYCC, enjoys tutoring fellow students through NYCC’s CELT (the Center for Excellence in Learning and Teaching) and conducting research. For relaxation he plays piano, guitar and harmonica, and is an outdoor enthusiast who enjoys rock climbing, mountain biking, sky diving, trail running, hiking, skiing, and camping. He has also worked in emergency medicine for the past five years.

His interest in chiropractic satisfies his desire to work with patients and to learn about the human nervous system. NYCC seemed a perfect fit for him in that he shares the College’s philosophy about chiropractic and it provides ample opportunities in areas of research and scholarship. Last trimester, DiMond clearly took advantage of NYCC’s rich offerings. He received the Excellence in Diagnostic Imaging Award, the Distinguished Accomplishment in Diagnosis Curriculum Award, and the Distinguished Service Award, and will graduate in November of this year.

The Online “Experience”

Mat has extensive experience with online education. His undergraduate coursework at IUP, the University of New England (UNE) and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) included roughly 60 credits of online classes. Each university has a different approach, he says. For example, IUP had a specific site that was set up for online education, similar to NYCC’s. UNE, on the other hand, sent him materials that he loaded and used on his computer, including video lectures and Virtual Lab software for chemistry experiments. EMS continuing education was offered at local hospitals and employed the use of Web sites and Web seminars – or webinars, as they are called.

DiMond’s first NYCC online class was his Complementary and Alternative Medicine course taught by Professor Julie Plezbert, DC. He now finds himself taking four online classes. What’s the key to successful online delivery? Communication. “The educator needs to anticipate every possible mishap and glitch

before offering a course online,” he responds. The syllabus needs to be pristine, and expectations clearly and succinctly noted; and it helps if the format is easy to navigate, he added. Mat finds that the Desire2Learn (D2L) online format used by NYCC includes many components that enrich the online experience - offering a wide variety of formats that facilitate learning, discussion boards, drop boxes, and inter-site emails, making it a one-stop place to conduct all online assignments. He also noted that D2L offers links to other NYCC pages a student will likely want to visit.

Although students will have personal preferences, DiMond has found that for some, online learning offers a degree of comfort. Most notable are the discussion boards, where some students truly embrace the opportunity to be expressive. “I am constantly impressed, and surprised, with the posts of some classmates, and often find it easier to encourage student performance through online posts,” he said.

Online Learning - from the Teacher’s View

From the other side of the lectern, DiMond first used e-mail to manage his students when he began tutoring students and answering many of their questions electronically. His weekly appointments with the students *via* email generated a “buzz” that caught the attention of several teachers. Following up on the teachers’ suggestions, he created PowerPoint presentations that included lectures and covered topics commonly regarded by the students as difficult topics. He posted the materials onto free

Faculty Spotlight

Margaret M. “Maggie” Finn, DC (NYCC 1992)

Margaret M. “Maggie” Finn, DC, MA, RN, FACC, associate professor of chiropractic clinical sciences at NYCC, is a 1992 graduate of NYCC who holds a bachelor’s degree in nursing from Pace University, a master’s degree in nursing from Adelphi University, and a Master of Arts in Teaching Using Internet Technology, from Marlboro University. Finn was inducted as a fellow in the American College of Chiropractic in 2004 and into the Sigma Theta Tau International Honors Society in Nursing in 1980. Needless to say, she’s been a pretty busy woman.

Why Chiropractic?

A former stand-up comedian, Finn began her career in medicine nearly 40 years ago as a nurse’s aide, and a surgical scrub technician, and finally as a trauma-center nurse. Eighteen years later, having achieved her goals in nursing she, as she puts it, “serendipitously” hurt her back on the job and quickly reported back to work under the care of Agnes Soberiaj, DC (NYCC ’81). As for careers - “I had been given my answer,” figured Finn who thereafter enrolled at NYCC on Long Island.

Her Journey

Raised in Jersey City, N.J., with seven siblings, Finn now lives in Rochester, N.Y., with her spouse Joy Collins, who shares her love of biking, hiking and kayaking, and with a Nova Scotia duck tolling retriever, Keeper. Finn also loves to cook and concocts all kinds of recipes with whatever is in the house.

Finn has been an educator for more than 20 years. She taught nursing and served as vice president of staff education at Good Samaritan Hospital in Suffern, N.Y. She thereafter provided instruction at NYCC, first as a registered nurse and subsequently, in 1994, as a doctor of chiropractic. Finn credits Lana Feldman, DC, who was also a registered nurse, as her mentor. To top off her remarkable history, Dr. Finn is also a proud breast-cancer survivor of almost seven years!

Dr. Finn’s work at NYCC has been wide ranging. In addition to her duties as an instructor, she has served as president and vice-president of the Faculty Senate; member of the Faculty Handbook, Faculty Advisory, and Academic Standing committees; as author and coordinator of the Physical Diagnosis portion of the Outcomes Assessment II exam. Finn contributed significantly to the College’s recent online educational initiatives by serving as the chair of the Learning Management System Selection Task Force. She had long had an interest in distance education, establishing Brightcourse, L.L.C., a company that offers continuing education.

She and her group were assigned the task of vetting online providers for the Master of Science in Applied Clinical Nutrition online program and they recommended the Desire2Learn server. Finn thanks the administration for entrusting the committee with the important task of recommending the learning management system provider for NYCC’s online programs. “We hope that our deliberative process demonstrates our desire to support the College’s mission for excellence that this institution embraces,” she said.

When asked what advice helped her to reach her goals, she said, “I believe that you need to love what you do. If it is in danger of becoming hackneyed or stale, either change your focus/attitude, learn something new in your profession to get the spark back, or switch to something different.” Her advice to current students: “Never stop loving everything in your life.”

NYCC Chiropractic Radiologists at the VA

Two New York Chiropractic College assistant professors recently earned clinical teaching privileges in the nation's veterans hospital system.

At the Canandaigua Veteran Affairs Medical Center, Jean-Nicolas Poirier, DC, and Chad Warshel, DC – both Diplomates of the American Chiropractic Board of Radiology – will contribute to the educational experience of NYCC chiropractic interns and radiology residents by reviewing diagnostic imaging of the VA's chiropractic patients. Their appointments, which became effective in November, are for two years.

At NYCC, Dr. Poirier is an assistant professor as well as the director of the Master of Science in Diagnostic Imaging (MSDI) program; Dr. Warshel is an assistant professor in the Department of Chiropractic Clinical Sciences. This new arrangement will provide NYCC interns and residents the valuable opportunity to view a broad variety of radiographs and advanced imaging. NYCC has one of the highest numbers of academic affiliations of any chiro-

practic college in the nation and is among the first to credential chiropractic radiologists, affording students the chance to train within a VA facility. "It's an incredible opportunity to review diverse imaging and assist in the education of our students," Warshel said.

The Canandaigua VA Medical Center, part of VA Healthcare Network Upstate New York, is located 30 miles southeast of Rochester, N.Y., in the heart of the Finger Lakes region. Seated on 150 acres, the facility maintains 14 patient-

care buildings. Providing inpatient and outpatient care to veterans living in upstate New York since 1933, the Medical Center provides numerous healthcare programs and services.

NYCC's MSDI residency, which began in 2005, is a three-year, full-time program devoted to the discipline of chiropractic radiology and consists of academic, clinical, and scholarly components. The program qualifies successful candidates to sit for the examinations leading to the professional certification "Diplomate of the American Chiropractic Board of Radiology" (DACBR).

Web sites. He then took his online teaching to the next level when he worked for an online tutoring service as an educator for SAT math preparation and general chemistry. Teachers and students would log on at the same time in a "chat room," where Mat could use a "white board" to draw images and examples that would enhance the interaction. "I felt as if I were working right next to the student," Mat explained.

"Perks" of Learning Online

DiMond particularly likes it that online learning allows students to work at their own pace. As a student (when feeling sufficiently motivated, that is) Mat would read a week's worth of chapters and take assigned quizzes in a matter of hours. Another big advantage of online learning is location: Students can earn a degree online from good colleges located halfway around the world without having to uproot. Finally,

there's the excellent feedback associated with online delivery. Assignments, tests and posts are submitted online. Students can see their test scores almost immediately. Faculty who operate online courses are easily accessible.

Online classes are definitely gaining steam as colleges throughout the globe adapt instruction to online delivery. The public embraces its ease and flexibility, and enjoys the benefits advanced degrees and professionally recognized credentials bring.

So long as students continue to complain about the number of hours students must remain glued to their seats in a classroom, DiMond sees potential for NYCC's and other online programs. He acknowledges that some hands on instruction such as technique favors in-person contact, but envisions a blend of the two in chiropractic's future.

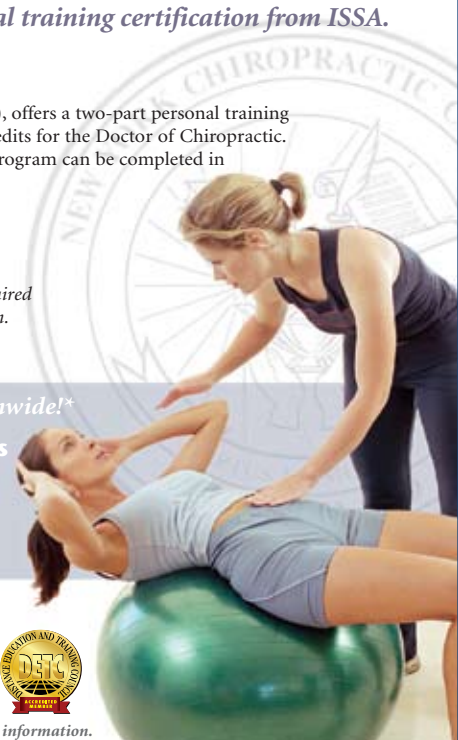

Research Symposium

NYCC Demonstrates its Commitment to Research

NYCC's 13th annual Research Symposium, complete with poster and platform presentations, was held for two days on campus in January as clinicians, faculty, and students presented and displayed their projects. This year's event featured 24 presentations, complete with information gathered by more than 33 researchers.

Q&A

Associate Professors John DeCicco, DC, William Lauretti, DC, and Professor Julie Plezbert, DC, answered questions that included, "What is the future of chiropractic?" and "What *really* are the different effects from different therapies?"

Eric Brand, LAc

Eric Brand, LAc, presented. His passion for the Chinese language and translations are widely recognized, making him a valuable asset as standing member of the advisory committee on English language terminology for the World Federation of Chinese Medicine Societies. As TCM (traditional Chinese medicine) advisor to the American Herbal Pharmacopoeia, he has visited schools worldwide, evaluating their herbal supplies as well as the source of information and education that acupuncture programs have been receiving. Chinese herbals, when used correctly, can reliably achieve therapeutic results, Brand explained. He also warned that possible regional variants may cause herbs to be prescribed wrongly resulting in toxicity. With study design and methodology assistance from NYCC Associate Professor Kevin Ergil, LAc, and Associate Professor Jason Wright, LAc, dean of the Finger Lakes School of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine of NYCC, Brand is attempting to increase the number of schools participating in his authentication study.

He had good things to say about NYCC, describing it as "the only school visited that has all herbals correctly labeled based on Chinese Pharmacopoeia."

Student Presenter

Andrea Nalli, an eighth-trimester chiropractic intern and only student presenting at this year's symposium said, "I am

participating in research here at NYCC in order to gain experience to conduct my own clinical research one day." Nalli used a tissue ultrasound palpation system (TUPS) to provide an objective and quantitative assessment of body tissues. What one "has to feel subjectively with fingers lacks scientific backing and cannot be proven quantitatively," he explained. The TUPS device has been in use over a decade to assess fibrotic tissues and scars and is now being viewed as an indispensable tool for the advancement of chiropractic. "I am honored to be a part of any aspect of NYCC's research endeavors because I know the results we get will better the chiropractic profession," Nalli remarked.

More than a hundred faculty members and students attended this year's research symposium. "Everyone in chiropractic should be involved in research, and I personally

think students will learn its importance by taking part in research presentations," said Nalli. Continued heightened interest from students casts NYCC as a leader in academic excellence and committed to scientific research.

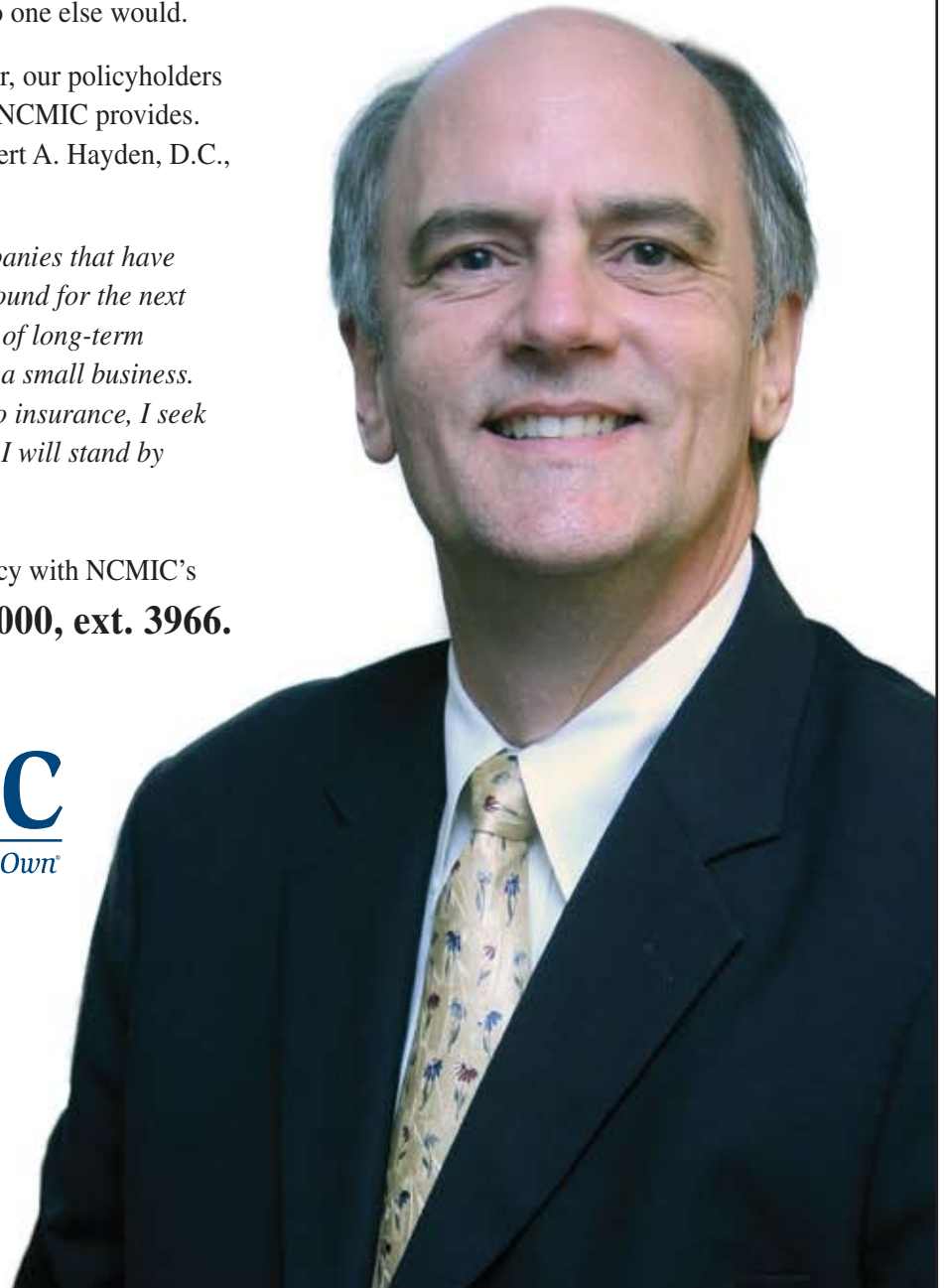

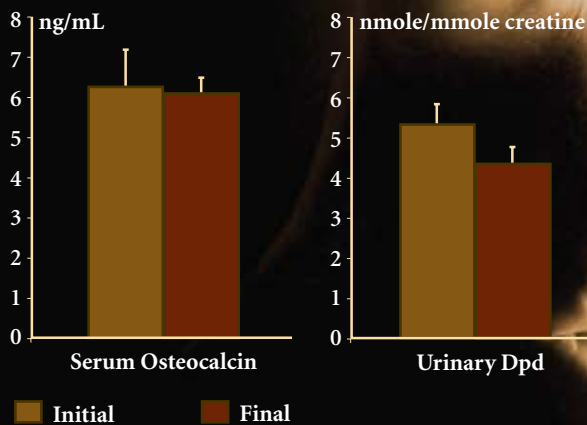
